
## Kansas City Attractions

Kansas City boasts many popular attractions for individuals and families. There many options available, with most open year-round.

Liberty Memorial and World War I Museum – The Liberty Memorial and WWI Museum is the only museum in the United States dedicated to World War I and the American soldiers who gave their lives in this conflict. The museum contains two theaters, a Renault FT-17 tank, uniforms such as Paul von Hindenburg's Model 1915 Field Jacket, guns, maps, photographs of major forces, propaganda posters and other "war booster" materials, state-of-the-art interactive displays, replicas of trenches, and a research center/library containing 60,000 archival documents and three-dimensional objects and nearly 6,000 library titles. Visitors are able to access the observation deck at the top of the Liberty Memorial to enjoy spectacular views of Union Station and downtown Kansas City. **Powell Gardens** – Powell Gardens Powell Gardens' history began in 1948, when George E. Powell, Sr., a prominent Kansas City businessman, acquired the beautiful tract of land that is now Powell Gardens. In 1969, in keeping with his stewardship philosophy, Mr. Powell donated the 640-acre farm to the Kansas City Area Council of the Boy Scouts of America, who used it as a regional camp until 1984. In 1984, with the University of Missouri's School of Agriculture as a catalyst and partner, the Powell Family Foundation began developing a horticultural and natural resource facility called Powell Center. In 1988, official ties with the University of Missouri ended and Powell Gardens Inc., a not-for-profit organization, was established. It maintains 6,000 plant species, with more than 225,000 individual plants. Powell Gardens is also home to the Heartland Harvest Garden, the nation's largest edible landscape.
